Advocates For Youth

(Two Year Grant) \$70,000

General Support. Advocates for Youth champions efforts to help young people make informed and responsible decisions about their reproductive and sexual health. Advocates believes it can best serve the field by boldly advocating for a more positive and realistic approach to adolescent sexual health. Advocates for Youth envisions a society that views sexuality as normal and healthy and treats young people as a valuable resource. The core values of Rights. Respect. Responsibility.® (3Rs) animate this vision.

Choice USA

(Two Year Grant) \$80,000

general support. Choice USA is the only national organization dedicated to building the leadership and large-scale participation of youth on reproductive justice issues. Our long-term goal is to ensure that young people have agency over their own bodies and relationships AND the power, knowledge and tools to exercise that agency. Through training, field support, and national leadership, Choice USA serves as a byway for young people to inform and be informed by the national movement.

Forward Together

(One Year Grant) \$75,000

General Support. Forward Together works with community leaders and organizations to transform culture and policy to catalyze social change. Our mission is to ensure that women, youth and families have the power and resources they need to reach their full potential. By developing strong leaders, building networks across communities, and implementing innovative campaigns, we are making our mission a reality.

Groundswell Fund

Fiscal sponsor: New Venture Fund

(One Year Grant) \$75,000

general support. Groundswell Fund supports a stronger, more effective U.S. movement for reproductive justice by mobilizing new funding and capacity-building resources to grassroots organizing and policy change efforts led by low-income women, women of color and transgender people.

Hampshire College

Fiscal Sponsor: Community Catalyst

(One Year Grant) \$40,000

Raising Women's Voices: Reproductive Health and Health Reform. Raising Women's Voices: Reproductive Health and Health Reform is a project advocating for implementation of the Affordable Care Act so that it meets the needs of diverse women and our families, especially for affordable, comprehensive coverage of reproductive health care. The MergerWatch Project of Community Catalyst will co-coordinate this work with the National Women's Health Network and the Black Women's Health Imperative, working through and with 25 RWV regional coordinators in the states.

National Advocates for Pregnant Women

(Two Year Grant) \$80,000

General Support. National Advocates for Pregnant Women combines legal advocacy, organizing, and public education to secure the human and civil rights, health and welfare of all women, focusing particularly on pregnant and parenting women. NAPW challenges civil and criminal prosecutions as well as anti-abortion and related measures that would create the basis for a separate and unequal system of law for all pregnant women whether they seek to end a pregnancy or go to term.

National Health Law Program Inc

(One Year Grant) \$25,000

Initiative to Promote Reproductive Health for Low-Income Women. The goal of NHeLP's Initiative to Promote Reproductive Health for Low-Income Women ("Initiative") is to increase reproductive health access for low-income women and women of color by advancing their legal rights to publicly financed health care.

National Institute for Reproductive Health

(One Year Grant) \$25,000

Urban Initiative for Reproductive Health. The Urban Initiative creates and sustains partnerships among policymakers and advocates at the city and county level, as well as networks of such advocates across the country, to promote reproductive health, rights, and justice. In 2014, UI will provide funding and technical assistance to local organizations, create and disseminate new resources, and build stronger relationships among local organizations and potential partners at the state level.

National Network of Abortion Funds

(Two Year Grant) \$110,000

General Support. To expand access to abortion for women who face the greatest barriers: low-income women, women of color, and young women.

Regents of the University of California

(Two Year Grant) \$70,000

Building CoreAlign's Programs.
